JOB SUMMARY:

Under the general supervision of Shift Sergeant. The Patrol Officer is the first to respond on all calls and do the primary investigation. Handle traffic and crowd control. Patrol the city for security. Enforce state laws and city ordinances. Answer calls for assistance from the public. Protect physical evidence at the scene. Advise suspects of their legal and civil rights. Performs such other duties as may be assigned.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

- Investigation of traffic accidents
 - Conduct frisk searches
 - Detect and stop suspects in motor vehicles or on foot
 - Conduct preliminary crime investigations
 - Respond to alarm systems for sign of unlawful entry
 - Conduct field searches of suspected persons
 - Prepare physical evidence for submission in court
 - Review report prior to testifying in court on traffic cases
 - Direct traffic
 - Make moral and ethical decisions that conform to law, department policy and other applicable regulations
 - Demonstrate proficiency in the use of firearms and the ability to maintain weapons for maximum performance
 - Follow a chain of command, receptive to supervision
 - Recognize the need for supervisory intervention and seek it when necessary
 - Transfer of prisoners
 - Complete required reports
 - Patrol highways and conduct investigations

OTHER JOB FUNCTIONS:

- Check homes of people on vacation and escort money or valuables in transfer
 - Must possess good reading, mathematical, decision making and supervisory skills
 - Obtain, draw up and execute complaints, arrest warrants, search warrants
 - Subject to call out.
 - Exposed to extreme weather conditions, work outdoors and indoors, electrical, explosives, radiation, fumes, odors, dust, chemical and toxic waste hazards
 - Work in confining and uncomfortable positions for long periods of time.
 - Must use hands, carry, lift, climb, drive, use PC, sit, stand, twist body, type and walk for extended periods of time
